Dear CTHA Members and Friends,

The Coolbaugh Township Historical Association is planning many events and programs for this summer. Our Annual Art Show will be held May 11 to 19 at the Wills Mansion Museum. We will have several history programs at the Wills Mansion this summer and our Community Yard Sale will be held on August 10. Steamtown is planning an excursion to Tobyhanna on October 12, and we will be planning some special events for the day. including a tour of the Tobyhanna Millpond #1 Icehouse and history tour of Tobyhanna. All are invited to participate. Our Annual Dinner Program will be on October 19 at the Pocono Farms Country Club with a program on the history of Pocono Farms. In January, we hosted the Sullivan Trail Questers for a visit and tour of the Wills Mansion in January. The Questers are a group of local folks interested in preserving local history and promoting education in historical preservation and restoration.

The 2024 Ice Harvest at Tobyhanna Millpond #1 was cancelled for the second year in a row due to thin ice. A fair number of people, including the Older Adult Learning Community and Boy Scout Troop 71 from Doylestown, came to the icehouse to hear about the history of ice harvesting. The CTHA had a display and program at the Nescopeck State Park Winterfest in February.

In early April, the CTHA conducted a guided History Hike of the remnants of the Warnertown Icehouse and associated buildings, plus a walk to the Warnertown dam and falls. Twenty people enjoyed the beautiful spring day to get some exercise and to hear about the Warnertown ice industry that spanned from 1902 to 1952.

The CTHA conducted an oral history interview with longtime Coolbaugh Township resident Harry Smith. Harry shared his vast knowledge about our local history including the Coolbaugh Township Volunteer Fire Company, schooling, work, and hobbies.

Regulations

- There is no fee for participation.
- Artwork must be exhibition ready. Work should be appropriately matted, framed, and wired for hanging.
- Size is limited to 36" in width and 36" in height. (Including frame)
- If submitting a sculpture or craft that requires a pedestal or special hanger, the artist must provide it at the delivery of the work.
- Sculpture size is limited to 36" in all directions. (Not including pedestal)
- Works shall depict any family friendly subject matter. Artists are urged to depict subject matter related to Coolbaugh Township.
- Artist registration and release form must be filled out and signed.
- Artists are responsible for insuring their work during the exhibition.
- Either the artist or a friend must deliver the works in person on the date indicated, and picked up on the date indicated. CTHA is not responsible for unclaimed works.
- Works may be offered for sale. CTHA requires a 20% commission on works sold. If you do not wish to sell your work, print NFS in the price category. For information on purchasing artwork please contact CTHA at 570-894-4207 or CTHA@ptd.net.

Approximately 100 years ago, Bradys Lake was the site of a large ice harvesting plant. Edward Brady managed the construction of a castle at Bradys Lake like their family castle in County Donegal Ireland. Only parts of the foundations of these massive structures remain. Summer History Program - The Mystery and Ruins of Devils Hole

Sunday, June 30, 2:00 pm at the Wills Mansion Museum

The Devils Hole, partially located in Coolbaugh Township, is shrouded in mystery and mystique. There are several building ruins along Devils Hole Creek, exciting water falls, stories about an Elk Farm, peculiar artifacts, and a significant impact from the 1955 flood. Bill Leonard will present a program about the "Seven Mysteries of Devils Hole - Folklore, Tales, and Legends."

Summer History Program - The Women Veterans Museum

Tentative, Sunday, July 14, 2:00 pm at the Wills Mansion Museum.

The museum in Mount Pocono was created to honor and celebrate women service members, veterans, and military family members for their past, present, and ongoing service to the United States. The founder Claudette Williams, a 30-year Army Veteran and Retired Sergeant Major, will talk about her firsthand experiences and her passion for preserving a legacy.

Summer History Program -Pocono Mountain Public Library

Sunday August 11, 2:00 pm at the Wills Mansion Museum

Ann Shincovich, Library Director, will present a program about the history of the Pocono Mountain Public Library, its beginnings, their wide array of services, and some stories.

D&H Annual Canal Festival – Saturday August 17, 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

D & H Canal Park, Lock 31, 179 Texas Palmyra Highway (Rt. 6), Hawley, PA. CTHA will have an informational booth exhibiting the historic ice industry and information about Coolbaugh Township history.

Community Yard Sale – Saturday August 10 (rain date Aug 11) 9:00 am to 3:00 pm

Numerous vendors will be selling their wares in front of the Wills Mansion at 5590 Municipal Drive, Tobyhanna. VFW Post 509 will be serving lunch and refreshments.

Visit to the Old Mill in Sciota – Sunday June 2, 2:00 pm

The CTHA will have a guided tour of the Old Mill in Sciota that was originally a log structure built by Jacob Brinker in 1730. The mill served as a storehouse for General John Sullivan's march through Pennsylvania. Following the Sullivan Expedition, the mill operations resumed. The mill has an overshot wheel which was used to grind corn to make various types of flour and feed. The tour will also include the Fenner/Snyder/Robacker estate, an 1805 stone home, across the street from the mill. Meet at the Wills Mansion at 1:15 to carpool, or meet at the Old Mill (5818 Business Rt 209 Sciota) at 2:00.

Visit to the Lackawanna Coal Mine – Friday September 20, 10:00 am

The CTHA will tour of this once abandoned and now restored hard coal mine that originally opened in 1860. The Coal Mine Tour is led by a miner, who will explain the fascinating methods used, and the heroic efforts involved, in deep mining's history. The mine is handicapped accessible with some restrictions. Meet at the Wills Mansion at 9:15 to carpool, or meet at the Coal Mine (Bald Mountain Road, Scranton) at 10:00 am.

Summer History Program - History of the Tobyhanna Conservation Association

September 15, 2:00 pm at the Wills Mansion Museum

The Tobyhanna Conservation Association was formed in 1966 by a group of local sportsmen, including the Gleoggler Brothers. The Charter states that "Conservation, a state of harmony between man and the land, and the proper harvesting of fish and game so as to retain nature's delicate balance, shall be the purpose of this organization." The presentation by Bill Leonard will cover the history of the organization, including raising trout, youth programs, and some Gleoggler Family history.
