• "Seven Mysteries of Devils Hole" — Sunday June 1, 2 p.m.

Pocono Mountain Library 5500 Municipal Blvd., Tobyhanna

The Devils Hole, partially located in Coolbaugh Township, is shrouded in mystery and mystique. There are several building ruins along Devils Hole Creek, exciting water falls, stories about an Elk Farm, peculiar artifacts, and a significant impact from the 1955 flood. The encore presentation by Bill Leonard is entitled "Seven Mysteries of Devils Hole: Folklore, Tales, and Legends."

• "Airport Inn & Mount Pocono Horse Show" — Sunday, July 27, 2 p.m.

Suzanne Fretz McCool will give a presentation about widely acclaimed Mount Pocono Horse Show which was held on the grounds of the Airport Inn (now Bailey's), from 1946 through 1948.

• Tobyhanna Military Reservation — Sunday, Sept. 14, 2 p.m.

The U.S. Army came to Tobyhanna in 1912, and they have been here ever since. This presentation by Bill Leonard will cover the multiple uses of the reservation, including artillery training, high explosives storage, prisoner-of-war camp, glider storage, state game lands and state parks, signal depot, and the Tobyhanna Army Depot of today.

Vern Cramer Saxe will give a presentation exploring the history and development of the township's educational institutions, highlighting their impact on the community.
